

TBFFC NEWS & NOTES

9 Nov: Annual Big Gun Shootout. We hosted our Big Gun on Picnic Island to rave reviews. About 50 folks attended and had a great time. Congratulations to Bryon Chamberlin, Nick Angelo and Colby Hane for winning as a team with a score of 1300. They narrowly edged Dave Chouinard, Chris Homer and Greg Peterson who scored 1290. Nick also tied with Cas Summers for the high individual score of 480 out of 500. Finally, Nick won the Big Gun long cast carrying 123 feet in the final. Other casters threw longer during qualifying and practice, but Nick delivered under the gun! I have emailed the spreadsheet with all the scores to newsletter recipients.

12 DEC: Play Hooky at the Port Manatee Hatchery. Arrive at 0800 hours to start fishing their ponds. Gina Russo will provide a lecture and tour starting around 1000. Bring 4 to 8 weight rods and small flies to fish for tarpon, snook and reds. Alligator Bob will provide lunch and the club will provide drinks. Sign up at the Dec meeting for a head count.

20 Dec: Don Coleman Outing: From Kirk Burton of the Suncoast Club. We hope you will join us to celebrate Don Coleman and fly fish Desoto on 20 December this year. Fishing starts at daybreak (park opens at 7:00 am) and we will have chili for lunch at noon. Lunch will be at the Gulf Pier pavilion adjacent to the Fort parking lot. SFF will provide chili and drinks, attendees are encouraged to bring a side dish to share with the group. This is always a fun outing so come out and enjoy Fort Desoto's famous fishing with us.

6 Dec: The Suncoast Club will host a casting clinic at Maximo Park. Improve your fly casting with Dayle Mazzarella, Pat Damico, and John Hand, IFFF Master Casting Instructors, as well as Leigh West and Steve Parker, TBFFC expert instructors and casters. Free to IFFF members. Others, just \$50. Better yet, you can join IFFF at this event for just \$35, regular or \$25 seniors, and then you can attend the outing for free. Maximo Park is next to O'Neils in St. Petersburg, just off exit 17 on I275; 8 am - 8:30 check-in. We will have some equipment for those who need it. A 6-wt. to 8-wt. rod with a 7-8 ft leader is recommended. We will have leader material, yarn, name tags, etc. We will familiarize participants with the format, layout, schedule, etc.

Fly of the Month

Instructions

1. Tie in the white hackle feathers, three on each side with the feathers curving in, not flared.
2. Tie in several strands of flash along each side
3. Tie in a collar of white fox tail in front of the hackles and extending back over the hackles.
4. Next, build the body by spinning the white deer hair in small bundles forward leaving $\frac{1}{4}$ inch.
Hint: Hair tips will point to the back. Place a small bunch of hair around hook, secure with two loose wraps, pull your thread down firmly; hair should spin.
5. Spin two clumps of red hair to finish the head.
6. Remove from vice and trim the body with a razor blade flat on the bottom. Trim the rest of the body to a tapered mullet shape.
7. Attach the eyes on each side using goop or other glue.

Fish among schools of mullet or along mangroves.

Materials

Hook: Gamagatsu 1/0
Six white hackle feathers
Holographic and crystal flashaboo
White and red deer **belly** hair
 $\frac{1}{4}$ inch 3-d silver eyes

RANDOM THOUGHTS FROM THE TYING BENCH

Instant Weed Guards: You have been fishing open water with your favorite fly, but now you start hanging up on weeds, grass, or oyster bars. Rather than changing the fly to a bendback fly or a fly with an attached weed guard, simply add an Instant Weed Guard to the fly you are already using while it is still tied to your leader. Here is how to prepare Instant Weed Guards.

Make a 5 turn Uni-Knot Loop in the end of some 20 pound monofilament (Not hard Mason). Tighten the knot until you can just pull on the standing part and adjust the size of the loop. Store several of these loops in a small plastic bag for use on the water. When you need a weed guard, simply take one of the pre-tied Uni-Knot Loops and slip it over the fly and tighten around the head of the fly. Use pliers to tighten the knot under the shank with the two “legs” of the knot projecting down to form a double weed guard. You may need to pull and tug the legs into position. Clip the legs to the length required. When you no longer need a weed guard, simply clip it off and discard—in your pocket please.



Fishing Report and Forecast

“What a great time to go fishing!”

Capt Pat Demico provide this report from his Captain’s Corner: Take advantage of area rivers that are really picking up with snook activity. Falling water temperature is causing snook and baby tarpon to head upriver to their winter haunts. Many fish that have been around river mouths, bridges and on beaches are migrating upriver and making feeding stops. Structure is the key as any diversion from a smooth bank often holds baitfish. Points, sand holes, channels, fallen trees and small mangrove islands must all be explored. Don't spend a lot of time in one spot. Cast accurately with baitfish patterns the size and color of what you see in the water. A cast that lands 3 feet from structure will not produce as well as one that is within inches or under fish holding obstacles. Watch your temperature gauge. Warmer water of only a couple degrees can be a hot spot. Fish will often be in groups, so when one or two are caught, continue fishing the area thoroughly. Keeping the boat parallel to shore with an electric motor, two experienced fly casters can work an area using different setups. For example, one with a floating line with a smaller fly and the other with a sink tip and a larger one. Most experienced river anglers prefer an outgoing tide, but often an incoming is better. //Pat

Capt Bryon Chamberlin notes good reports of jacks, spinner sharks and a few cobia at the warm water flow at the power plant on the East side of the bay.

Capt Frank Rhodes notes the East Shore of Tampa Bay around the Kitchen or Cockroach Bay will produce good action on low winter tides as fish are concentrated in holes. Try Mags Hole (found on your chart) in Cockroach for very good trout action.


