Fly Fishing the Everglades

The Ten Thousands Islands and Everglades National Park comprise one of the most remote, challenging and productive fly fishing destinations in Florida. Longtime TBFFC members Rick and Nanette O'Hara consider themselves privileged to have fished these waters regularly for about six years, and were the 2009 Fly Rod team champions of the IGFA RedSnook Tournament out of Naples. Although they caution that it would take several lifetimes -- and the entire worldwide supply of Cutter's Deep Woods Off -- to fully explore the maze of mangroves, tidal creeks and back bays that are the saltwater Everglades, they will share some of their tips for successfully fishing this premier area. They'll also reveal why they consider a "Devil Stick" -- commonly known as a spinning rod -- an essential piece of equipment for Everglades backcountry adventures.

Featured Fly Tyers Denise Bruner---- and You

Denise was born in the Lower Peninsula of Michigan and grew up on a part-time farm outside of Ann Arbor and was fortunate to have the opportunity to explore and fish the ponds and wetlands on the farm with her 5 brothers and sisters. She relocated to Florida in 1980, and currently has a job in downtown Tampa overlooking Tampa Bay.

She started Saltwater fishing in the Bay Area in the mid 80's. Catching four Snook on the first outing was all it took to start a life long hobby addiction. She has fished the fresh waters in several states, mostly for trout, but also for smallmouth bass. One thing she has found is that wherever she goes to fly-fish she has met other anglers and felt like part of an extended family. Denise joined TBFFC 15 years ago, and is a member of its Board of Directors. She started tying flies about 10 years ago, mostly on an as needed basis (an upcoming trip can motivate her to bring out the vise). This time she will be tying a favorite smallmouth fly.

Our regular fly tying tutorial "Bull session" for members will begin at 5:30.

October is upon us and the weather should start to cool down just a little. The waters around us too will be cooling down a bit, which will get the fish more active.





TIPS FOR TBFFC - No. 28

Casting Tip for TBFFC: 11

Why does my line kick at the end of a cast?

I was asked his question recently by an excellent caster from our club who practices frequently, which is why he casts so well. He was using a 3 wt rod and as his cast lengthened the end of his line did not straighten very well. In discussing the problem, I asked what kind of leader he was using and he said he did not have a leader or fly on the end of his line.

Bruce Richard in his excellent book Modern Fly Lines has the following on pg. 70: "It should be mentioned that the tapered leaders tied to the end of fly lines continue the dissipation of casting energy.....Lines are designed to be cast with leaders. A properly designed line will have just the right amount of energy left at the end of a cast to turn over the leader and deliver the fly. If a line is cast without a leader, it will "kick" and be difficult to cast."

A properly designed leader and "fly" will help when you are out lawn casting as much as it will when in a fishing situation.


2. FIND THE TIDES



FLY OF THE MONTH

Stimulator

As Tied by Logan Valeri



MATERIALS:

Hook: Curved shank; Size 6-14.

Thread: 6/0 Gudebrod or equivalent, colored to match the body.

Tail: Elk hair.

Body: Dubbing that is designed for dry flies. Color to match the body of the natural

(yellow, tan, **olive**,).

Rib: Fine silver or gold wire.

Body Hackle: Brown or tan saddle or neck hackle, Palmered over the body and ribbed with fine wire

Wing: Elk hair, tied to flare slightly.

Head: Red dubbing

Head Hackle: Grizzly hackle wrapped dry fly style near the head.

TYING STEPS:

- 1. Start the thread and tie in a ribbing wire down the hook bend slightly.
- 2. Tie in a short tail of elk hair. Use just enough thread pressure to flare the hair slightly.
- 3. Create a body of dubbing or yarn. Leave enough room at the front of the hook for a wing and a hackle.
- 4. Wrap a hackle back to the hook bend keeping the curvature of the hackle facing forward. Rib the hackle down with the wire. (This is called a Palmered hackle.)
- 5. Create an elk hair wing using the same steps you would use for an elk hair caddis. Traditionally this wing is only long enough to reach the start of the tail, but you can make it a bit longer.
- 6. Clip the hair butts, tie them down to the hook and cover with thread to form a smooth transition from the wing to the hook eye.
- 7. Tie in a grizzly hackle and dub the area in front of the wing to just behind the hook eye.
- Wrap the hackle over the dubbing as you would in any standard dry fly, except keep it slightly sparse.
- Trim the hackle, whip finish and cement. A drop of cement on the front of the wing will help keep the wing together.

Fishing Report and Forecast "What a great time to go fishing!"

Greg Peterson reports of finding big reds in the bay. He took a good friend, **Norman Claypool** and wife Sept 2nd and caught 3 nice reds. While Norman was reeling in a fish Greg saw more tailing fish and jumped out of the boat and waded for them and caught one on fly. Friday Greg took student **Brandon Swinford** who made a great cast to a group of about 40 tailing reds and got slammed with a big red. The only bad thing is Brandon's fish was bigger than Greg's so he probably will not be able to live it down for some time. Way to go Brandon..

Member **John Willis** reports his wife **Joan** eased up and let him catch two 10 inch browns on the Nottely River near Blairsville, Ga. the fly used was a chartreuse wooly bugger he tied. John reports they were released unharmed.

Nick Colantonio, fishing with last month's speaker, Neil Taylor, caught a number of trout on chartreuse bend back flies.

Capt Rick Grassett reported by email that his clients are catching trout and blues on clouser flies in Siesta Key and Sarasota Bay's Bishop Point.

Robert Fischer, fishing both sides of the bay, reports catching lots of small trout and a few big trout using white big headed fly with a white rabbit strip tail and on Mangrove snook fly.

Capt Byron Chamberlin reported that tarpon season is pretty much over. He also is reporting seeing schools of 50 to 200 reds on the flats. Trout action is very good on the deeper grass flats and can be caught using clouser minnows. Night fishing the dock lights will get you bigger trout.
