


TBFFC NEWS & NOTES

Club member Jeff Abeles is planning a trip to Gray Reef Anglers and Wingshooting Lodge in Casper, Wyoming in either mid July or mid September 2021. We will be fishing the N. Platte river specifically the Gray Reef and the Miracle Mile sections. Great dry fly fishing on the river at that time of the year. I've done a lot of trout fishing over the past 30 plus years. I can count on one hand the rivers I've fished with this many quality fish ranging from 18 to 21 inches. And they weren't the big ones. Due to excess weeds in September, the Miracle Mile was fishing slow with an occasional 25 inch'er plus being caught. The fish hatchery at Port Manatee is transitioning to this new site and will open in 2021. In addition to the Youth Center, the **Florida Aquarium** has a research building where they care for sea turtles and study coral and sea urchins among other things. It turns out sea urchins keep coral clean of algae. Who would have known that? We also had a great tour of all the facilities safely from outside. The club may be able to have a kayak outing there in 2021.

She noted FWC was trying to locate spawning sites and that I should report my find. The app is free and easy to use. It allows you to create and report on all sorts of plants and animals you find on your outings. Please give it a try and help keep our FWC scientists informed!



Good winter fishing continues. I caught a beautiful red on 30 Dec at Cypress and Rich Gorden got two nice ones. My other fish is one of 23 reds at Wacasassa, my best day ever in early December. Fishing Report and Forecast "What a great time to go fishing!"

Kayak guide Neil Taylor reports: I can tell you for a fact: I wait for this all year. The big fish of winter are a reality. Every year it is the case. If you know where to go, it's easy. The last three trips, 15 fish over 17 inches for each person It's trout. The bluefish of winter are next. Seven to nine pound bluefish are going to be regular. That hasn't happened yet but it's coming. The Neil Fly has done great and isn't hard to tie. It is a lot of gold with a weighted head. Usually some white as a base I honestly believe it could be all gold and it would work the same. Like with lures, speed is important. If you are not catching fish try stripping slower. Capt Rick Grassett reports: Fish the coastal gulf for tripletail when conditions are good. Fishing deep grass flats of Sarasota Bay is a good choice for action with a variety of species including trout, blues and Spanish mackerel. Shallow water action for reds and snook is also a good option now. Our natural resources are under constant pressure from red tides fueled by industrial, agricultural and residential runoff, freezes, increasing fishing pressure and habitat loss and degradation, please limit your kill, don't kill your limit!






