

p.s. When you find one of their big feathers, stick it in your hat. It never hurts to have a white pelican disguise to fool those picky reds.






### Fishing Report and Forecast "What a great time to go fishing!"

Capt. Pat Damico sends this from his Captain's Corner Escape the wind! Fly fisherman need flexibility this

time of year with frequent cold fronts and windy conditions being the norm. Usually, I mentally plan my charter the night before but several recent trips were changed at the last minute because of wind intensity and direction. Some of the worse days had us go to one of the many rivers that empty into the gulf or bay. After driving over some of our bridges and seeing whitecaps it was a pleasure to launch where we were greeted with calm conditions. When you travel up a river it becomes narrower and is protected by trees and often high banks affording both you and the fish warmth and protection as well as a chance to observe undisturbed wildlife. Snook, jacks, reds, ladyfish and small tarpon will be caught next to bass and panfish because of lower salinity from fresh water influence. It is best to rig several rods, one with a floating line, another with a clear sinking tip and a third with full sinking line. This way you can easily handle fish that are in the shallows as well as those that prefer deeper water. When sight fishing is not possible, target structure such as docks, points, feeder creeks, stumps, partially submerged trees and bridges with small flies, size 6-1, that imitate the baitfish you observe. Develop a pattern after catching a few fish and concentrate on the conditions that rewarded you with your success. **Kayak guide Neil Taylor** reports fishing has slowed in January due to windy conditions. However, warmer weather and longer days will help as Spring approaches. When we have gotten out we have had very good results with big trout. We had one day where every trout was over 20 inches. The second great thing was the schools of bluefish. They are 5 to 7 pounds and are good fighters. I put them in the smoker for an hour longer than other fish and make them into fish spread. We caught about 15 bluefish in an hour one day.

**Club member Ted Hagaman** reports: Epic day on Macdill flats. Everything came together on 21st of Jan. Extreme negative tide on a cold 40 degree morning. Strong north wind to push the water even lower and hold it out. Clear cloudless sky. Clear water and lots of fish, at least in the area I was fishing. Found fish as soon as I got in the right depth of water. Caught 8 reds on Chris Tripoli's redfish pattern(see Mar 2018 newsletter) One 30" and another 28" the rest were all 24-25".

#### Capt. Rick Grassett reports: Capt. Rick Grassett's Fishing Report for 1/26/2019

Fly anglers fishing with me, out of CB's Saltwater Outfitters on Siesta Key, had fast action catching and releasing snook and hefty blues on flies in the ICW at night recently. Spin fishing anglers also had some action with reds and trout on DOA Lures in Gasparilla Sound.

Jerry Poslusny, from Palmetto and Rich Hunter, from Longboat Key, fished the ICW at night for snook on a trip with me recently. They had their personal best trip catching and releasing snook and bluefish to 5-lbs on my Grassett Snook Minnow fly! Martin Marlowe, from NY and Tim Hearon, from Siesta Key, also got in on the action. They also caught and released numerous snook and nice blues on the same fly on another trip. Great action and the blues are a welcome addition, since they fight as hard as or harder than snook of the same size!

Fishing dock lights in the evening is usually a good option for catch and release snook fishing this time of year, although it is dependent on tide and conditions. Fishing shallow flats is both challenging and rewarding. It usually requires fishing hard to find and catch fish. You may not catch big numbers of fish but you may catch some good ones. Our natural resources are under constant pressure from red tides fueled by agricultural and residential runoff, freezes, increasing fishing pressure and habitat loss and degradation, please limit your kill, don't kill your limit!




