

CDC Notice Regarding Meeting Places

In order to protect the health of TBFFC members, all attendees must self-screen for symptoms or other risk factors of COVID-19 before attending monthly meetings.

Your answer must be "no" to the following questions before attending:

- Have you experienced any of the following symptoms in the past 48 hours: fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea?
- Have you been in close physical contact in the last 14 days with anyone who is known to have laboratory-confirmed COVID-19 OR anyone who has any symptoms consistent with COVID-19?
- Are you isolating or quarantining because you may have been exposed to a person with COVID-19 or are worried that you may be sick with COVID-19?
- Are you currently waiting on the results of a COVID-19 test?
- Have you traveled in the past 10 days?




FFI Conservation Action: Here is an update from Tom Logan on FFI actions to support clean water:


Good morning, FFI Board Conservation Committee Members and Leadership. Please see the attached letter, wherein FFI and 73 of our Conservation Partners and other organizations provide recommendations to the USACOE regarding implementation guidance for the Water Resources Development Act of 2020. The recommendations generally are to place high priority on natural and nature-based solutions to water resource issues and resilience to climate change. FFI has endorsed similar recommendations in earlier correspondence with our partners. This letter expands and reaffirms broad support of the conservation and outdoor recreation community for science-based management of our lands, waters and the species that depend upon these landscapes as habitat.










Club member Rich Gorden sent this in: When you have a bunch of **S** worth of fly tying stuff, and it's your wife's birthday, you make stuff.

Fishing Report and Forecast "What a great time to go fishing!"

Kayak guide Neil Taylor reports: The cool months are over along with the great fishing associated with them. That's just the deal. We live here, we deal with it. It will be good part of the time, but the heat and the sunlight will diminish opportunities. Sorry, but that's the deal. Best to go by 5:45am and quit by 10am. June to October: It's going to be tougher. On the fly, strip slower when the bite isn't best. That will help create some results. When the baitfish is small, the flies will work great. Flies with a lot of gold in them have done the best on my trips. There's other colors but the gold part seems to be important . Even though it's summer get out and have some fun. It's fun even when the fishing isn't great. Contact Neil at Livelybaits@aol.com Phone: 727-692-6345.

Captain Pat Damico reports: Fly fishing for early season tarpon on the beach has begun. Get out at daybreak with an easterly wind and calm water to take advantage of great tarpon action. Get at these fish now because they haven't been beaten up yet by hordes of fishermen and are in the pre-spawn mode making them more likely to grab a well-presented fly. Position your boat close to shore with the sun at your back. Good polarized glasses will allow you to see their flash as they lazily roll on the surface occasionally showing inside of swim markers. Use 11 weight fly rods with a floating or sink tip line. Have your fly at the fish's depth. A 40-60 wt fluorocarbon shock tippet tied to a size 1 to 1/0 Keys type or toad pattern in darker colors has been most successful. Minimize boat movement using only a push pole in shallow water. The ideal cast is having the fish come straight to you, then place the offering in her path. Figure out a pattern where most fish are moving and have them come to you. If you haven't been using heavier rods, practice before getting on the water. Use your body to make casting easier and then use your body to fight the fish, not your arms. If anchored, a floating marker buoy with a quick disconnect will allow you to chase hooked fish and then return to your spot. *Fly fisherman Pat Damico charters Fly Guy in lower Tampa Bay and can be reached at captpatdamico.com and 727-504-8649.*

Capt Rick Grassett reports: You should find snook in the surf, in passes and around docks and bridges in the ICW near passes. You can walk the beach and sight fish them in the surf with fly tackle. Small baitfish fly patterns, like my Grassett Snook Minnow, should work well. Many of the same flies that work in the surf will also work well at night. Snook will congregate in passes around the new and full moons to spawn, so docks and bridges close to passes will usually hold more fish this time of year.

Fishing for reds should also be good in June. Look for them over shallow grass, along mangrove shorelines or around oyster bars when the tide is high. You'll find them in potholes or edges of flats when the tide is low. Fly anglers should score with baitfish fly patterns like my Grassett Flats Minnow or Gurglers.

You may find trout, Spanish mackerel, bluefish or pompano on deep grass flats this month. I like to drift and cast ahead of my drift with Ultra Hair Clouser flies tied on long shank hooks on an intermediate sink tip fly line. You'll need to add a few inches of heavy (40 or 50-pound) fluorocarbon when toothy fish are in the mix. Look for deep grass flats with a mix of grass and sand and a good tidal flow for the best action.




