Prepare for Tarpon on a Fly

While recently discussing saltwater fly fishing with a group of freshwater anglers the bucket list for every one of them included coming to Florida and catching a big tarpon with a fly rod. I then asked a couple of questions. What is the heaviest fly rod you ever used and can you cast 50 feet with accuracy in most wind conditions with one or two false casts? Most never cast anything heavier than a 5 weight rod, their usual trout streams were small, often wind protected, requiring very short unrushed casts and they usually false cast multiple times to, "Dry their fly." How then are they going to use an 11 weight rod with a large bulky fly, cast accurately to an often moving target, difficult to see under frequent cloudy, windy conditions? They stared at me without answering. The videos we see showing an experienced angler casting to, hooking with a strip strike and landing a large tarpon often may take a few days to put together. They must invest considerable time in preparing for a successful trip. This would begin by researching their intended location, talking to local fly shops and some recommended guides and finally getting some good instruction so that necessary practice before the trip will be time well spent. Like many things, it may look easy but isn't.

Brooks Falls Trip


Several club members traveled to King Salmon Alaska this Sept for some rainbow and silver salmon fishing. We stayed a week at the Naknek River Fishing Lodge run by the Johnson family. Although the silver salmon were not plentiful this year, we did manage to catch enough to fill a shelf in the freezer and found some big rainbow trout.

The highlight for all of us was a fantastic day trip to the famous Brooks Falls River. Crossing 28 miles by boat across Naknek Lake, we landed on the far shoreline of Brooks Falls Park. Greeting us the beach was a beautiful float plane and our host, our first brown bear. As the grizzly bears have the right of away in this area, we were held up in the water until the bear wandered down the shore and past us. Luckily for our sake he didn't decide to lie down for a snooze or our fishing would have been delayed. We attended the 20 minute Bear School and then were off to the boardwalk to the viewing area of these classic falls. Two bears were at the falls and entertained us with their play for salmon. We stayed about 30 minutes and then headed out into the river ourselves with our guides Mario Chance and Josh DeYoung. The river was shallow, with gravel bars and crystal clear water which made easy sight casting thru the thousands of red sockeye salmon to target the giant rainbows who feast on the salmon eggs. Streamers, mouse patterns and salmon fish eggs were all casted at these beautiful fish but the eggs were the most successful. Mario and Josh gave great instructions and joined the rest of us hooting and hollering as these colorful large rainbows would attack our flies and took our lines screaming down the river. Several huge fish got us into the backing of our lines as they gave us a fight worthy of any saltwater fish their size.

Adding to the adventure were these historic bears who chased us off the river 4 times. They would appear coming out of the woods and grasses and step out into the river and walk in our direction. Somehow the lure of the river and rainbows kept us wanting to be in the river and their presence added to the mystique of the area vs the full scope of having a 2000 ton animal that could kill you with one bat of his paw and kept us wanting to fish the river

Captain Rick Grassett reports tarpon are moving from the coastal gulf to inside areas of Charlotte Harbor and Tampa Bay as they thin out in the gulf. You might also find juvenile tarpon in creeks and canals this time of year. Fishing mangrove shorelines for catch and release reds and snook may also be a good option. Night fishing for snook and more is a dependable option and a good way to beat the heat. 




