Tom H. Logan, Chairman of the FFI Board Conservation Committee reports this good news.

I am pleased to share "National Wildlife Refuges: A Hunting and Fishing Perspective" with you. This is an excellent report with "Hunt-Fish Tenets For Refuges" that FFI has sponsored along with our many Conservation partners that is intended to further opening National Wildlife Refuges to both hunting and fishing. The Tenets of this report generally recommend and provide a basis for expanding hunting and fishing opportunities on National Wildlife Refuges. A total of 567 NWRs exist with 427 of them open to hunting and 376 open to fishing. Clearly, there is additional and compatible opportunity for expanding these recreational activities on those NWRs that remain closed. The report also speaks to the financial role hunters and fishers have played in funding fish and wildlife management programs through purchase of hunting and fishing licenses and payment of federal sales taxes on purchase of fishing and hunting equipment for decades

Ron Cavalier's Lazy Susan Tip for FLY Tieing

The problem is that I make a lot of shrimp and crab patterns as well as minnow patterns and it's a pain to try to adjust eyes on flies without twisting the vise to see how I attached them. I finally came up with the idea that you will see in the attached photo. I bought this 10'' lazy susan from Amazon for \$9.00. Someone asked me if the table moved while I tied and I said yes, it does, however unless you are a one armed fly tyer, most of us place our left hand on the vise to hold material in place or to tightly wrap the thread onto the material. The table worked better than I had hoped for. It's now a real pleasure tying the patterns I tie as a simple turn of the vise on the table toward me gives me a perfect view of the eyes on the hook and any adjustments I need are done before I secure the eyes with U.V. material. This one is a no brainer for any of the tyers who experience this same problem while tying.

Fishing Report and Forecast "What a great time to go fishing!"

Captain Pat Damico reports: How do I strip my fly? Next to, "What fly should I use?" this is a very frequent question. On a recent saltwater charter, two clients told me about trips made during their last couple of days when they caught nothing after 6 hours of wade fishing. Stopping the boat in a wind-protected area, I asked each one to cast for me. Both were very poor casters, with layouts of their line full of slack. Holding the rod tip about 5 feet above the water, when they did strip, the fly never moved. Each did a couple of casts and "worked" the fly, and their Clouser minnow did not move in any of their presentations. No fish would show interest in a baitfish imitation that didn't move. Their stripping to give the fly appropriate action varied considerably. I told them to watch the end of their floating fly line where it joined the butt section of the leader. This gives you a very good indication of what your fly is doing. Saltwater fish usually like to have the fly on their level. If they are on the bottom in 5 feet of water, a fly on the surface is rarely taken. Sometimes with the tide coming toward you, it is necessary to exaggerate the long frequent strips to give the fly the desired action. Keeping the rod tip close to the water during the retrieve and at the beginning of the cast also helps reduce slack

Capt Rick Grassett reports: Many tarpon will move into estuaries this month. You may also find juvenile tarpon in creeks, canals and turning basins. Reds should be schooling on shallow flats and big trout will prowl the same waters at dawn. Also, look for trout on deep grass flats mixed with blues, pompano, Spanish mackerel and more. Catch and release snook fishing should be good around lighted docks at night or in the surf. Look for false albacore (little tunny) to possibly show up in the coastal gulf later in the month. Reds should school up this month, although their numbers have been thin for the past couple of years. You should find them on shallow flats where they'll be easier to find when the tide is low. Look for "nervous" water when it is slick calm or a slick patch of water when there is a ripple on the water. They may push a wake that looks like a boat wake. I try to be as quiet as possible in shallow water, poling to locate them. Once you've located a school of reds, try to get ahead of them to intercept them, much like tarpon fishing. If you work around the edges of the school, you may be able to catch a few of them before they spook. We often also find big jacks, blues and other predators in the mix along with reds. Fly poppers or Gurglers may draw some big strikes!
