





White Elephant Exchange

Players draw names to determine what order they will go in

The first player selects a gift from the pool and opens it

Make sure everyone can see the gift!

- The following players can choose to either pick an unwrapped gift from the pool or steal a previous player's gift. Anyone who gets their gift stolen in this way can do the same choose a new gift or steal from someone else.
- To keep things moving along, there are a couple of limits on gift swapping:
- A present can only be stolen once per turn, which means players who have a gift stolen from them have to wait to get it back.
- After three swaps, the turn automatically comes to an end (otherwise things could drag on for a *long* time).
- Three Swaps and the Gift is Out. If a present gets stolen three times, it's out of the game and the person who holds it gets to walk away with it.
- After all players have had a turn, the first player gets a chance to swap the gift he or she is holding for any other opened gift. Anyone whose gift is stolen may steal from someone else (as long as that person hasn't been stolen from yet). When someone declines to steal a gift, the game comes to an end.
- Note that for this last "extra" turn, the three-swap rule doesn't apply. Players can keep swapping until someone decides to stand pat, or there are no other eligible people to steal from.


FFI Vertual Expo was a Success

Those at FFI want to extend our sincere thanks to all who attended the Virtual Expo last weekend. The event was an overwhelming success, with almost 600 registered participants enjoying 130 sessions. The Expo was three full days with sessions non-stop for 10-12 hours a day. 80+ presenters and 30+ moderators generously donated their expertise and time and were supported by 14 tech support people including staff, volunteers and consultants.

Whether in the cypress dugouts of the Calusa, Dimock's wood-and-canvas tarpon fishing canoe or modern fiberglass and plastic, humans have been paddle fishing in Florida for thousands of years. Sprinkling colorful history throughout, author John Kumiski highlights the state's best paddle fishing destinations, both freshwater and saltwater, including the bass of Farm 13, the redfish and trout along the Big Bend Paddling Trail and the snook and tarpon of the Everglades. Learn the locales and what to do when you get there, including launch points, shuttles, rentals, tackle, techniques and more.



Club member Ron Cavalier shared this:

"I have another tip for our fly tying club members.

I purchased what I have shown below from Amazon. The kit comes with tips, small bottles etc. This is by far the best way to apply super glue in tight places without using a brush or getting it all over the place.

What is more important is that when you buy a bottle of thin super glue, you squeeze the contents into one of the bottles that comes in the kit, you place the next tip over the bottle and add the long extender and you are set to go.

No capping the bottle, no more wasted bottles because they become contaminated.

The super glue comes out each time you squeeze the bottle in a tiny drop to be applied where needed.

The tip does not contaminate itself and if it does clog (fur or feathers) you just cut a 1/64th off the tip and you are ready to go again.

For the most part they do not contaminate and the super glue runs back into the bottle when you set it up right when completed.

The great part is it's under \$10.00 for the entire kit (see below) and free shipping if you are a prime member of Amazon.

I have been using the first bottle I bought with the same tip since August and it has not failed me and I tie flies every day.

CHATTOOGA OUTING Nov 5-12, 2021

Seven members of the fly club made the trip to Oconee State Park, South Carolina in early November for the Chattooga Annual Trout Outing. This year we stayed in some of the oldest cabins at the park, which were built in the 1930's by the Civilian Conservation Corps. The park is beginning to renovate some of the cabins' kitchens and baths while adding some updated furniture and cookware, including new comfortable beds! We were fortunate to have one of the updated cabins. Most of our members are excited about these changes, while a few holdouts like the rustic primitiveness of the original build. There was no cell service or internet access in these older cabins, so very primitive by electronic standards. However, this left more time for camaraderie and friendship as we spent the evenings sharing delicious meals, good conversation and great stories.

We fished various areas of the Chattooga and Chauga Rivers and had great success catching decent size rainbows, browns and even brookies! The rivers had been stocked the week before with fairly large rainbows and they were fun to catch and release, as this is delayed harvest time. Those fish will stay in the river and grow fatter but wiser thru the winter until trout season opens again May 15th. This area is a year round fishery and a day's drive from the Tampa area which makes for a great trip anytime to get out and use our freshwater fly fishing gear and skills. 





Good job Tim! Biscayne Bay is a great place for big bonefish and Joe is a super guide. Only a short drive away and I encourage club members to check it out.

Fishing Report and Forecast "What a great time to go fishing!"

Captain Pat Damico reports: Shallow-water fishing for trout, reds, and snook continues to accelerate as water becomes cooler. Frequent late-afternoon thunderstorms are diminishing and evening fishing opportunities will become more attractive. The last couple of hours of sunlight have been productive. As long as the water is moving, fish will be active. To become one of the 10 percent that catches 90 percent of the fish, use a fishing log, where information for each trip is cataloged. I use a composition book. Water temperature and clarity, tide information, wind direction and speed, location of feeding birds, either diving or wading, and successful baits or flies used will give you a good start on choosing your fishing location as well as tactics. Avoid fishing the same spot where you once had a great day. Information collected from previous years for today's conditions will eliminate a lot of guesswork. Mullet schools have been good locators of redfish and large trout. As weeds and grass diminish, topwater lures and poppers for your fly rod have provided explosive strikes. Reds, because of their low-slung mouth, have difficulty eating surface presentations, so delay setting the hook until you feel the fish. This takes concentration and discipline. Keep your rod tip low and close to the water to feel fish hit and to set up your next cast more effectively. Eliminate slack and have a straight line or fly line between you and the fish.

Capt Rick Grassett reports: After a hiatus from the trip due to COVID restrictions last year, I hosted a group of friends and clients at Mars Bay Bonefish Lodge in South Andros. We waded vast sand flats and also fished from flats skiffs for everything from large cruising or tailing single and double bonefish to large schools of fish. Conditions were tough on a couple of days with wind and rain but action was fairly good on those days. There were also a couple of slower days but overall actions was good and included a few bonefish in the 4 to 6-pound class and a couple of double digit fish. Top producing flies during the week were Peterson's Spawning Shrimp, Mars Bay Special, Ververka's Mantis Shrimp, Gotchas and Gotcha variations. Overall it was a great trip to a great lodge!






