If you know of a prospective guest speakers please let us know. We are always on the hunt for interesting and informative talks.



Book Review Mile Marker Zero by William McKeen

I have been re-reading some books and finished this one again recently. I enjoyed it the second time as much as the first. I recommend it for any Florida fly fisherman as an interesting narrative about Key West as well as fishing. Mr. McKeen did a first rate job with his description of the Key West scene and its characters based on many interviews. He goes into great detail about the artists, writers and fisherman who played and worked in Key West in the 1960's and 1970's. Names you might know include Earnest Hemmingway, Tom McGuane, Guy de la Valdene, Russel Chatham, Tennessee Williams and Hunter S. Thompson. These folks led wild and interesting lives and their time in Key West reflected a unique counter-culture in American history. McGuane wrote and filmed a movie of his book 92 In the Shade while there and Valdane filmed the cult movie *Tarpon*. This movie, which we have shown at the club, has spectacular scenes of tarpon fishing in the 1960's. This book is available on line at the library if you want to check it out. //Walt



Fly Fishing Tip of the Month by Jonas Magnusson

Fly casting tip #3

The Mars tip considered what happens if there was too much bending (radial movement) of the wrist (abduction) in the **horizontal** plane. So, it's logical to consider what happens when we over-abduct the wrist in the **vertical** plane. The angle between the underarm and the rod then becomes, say 90 degrees. Beginners and intermediate casters do this frequently on their back-casts. This will send the line careening down behind the caster, and thus it will be traveling in a great big arc in the vertical plane. When the wrist bending (radial movement - abduction) is kept minimal the rod is stopped just past vertical, the caster will have a much straighter line behind and now has consequently the foundation to a good forward cast.

Little Neck Clams on the Grill

Here is a recipe from WBUR, a non-profit organization. It is a simple, tasty dish made quickly on your grill. Wrap littleneck or cherrystone clams in a large piece of foil and top with chopped tomatoes, garlic, scallions and a touch of olive oil; season with pepper. You can also add chunks of spicy chorizo sausage and we sometimes add mushrooms. Seal the packet and place on a hot grill for 6-8 minutes. The clams should just be open and the juices sizzling. If the clams have not opened, carefully reseal the packets and grill for another 2 to 3 minutes. The clams release their briny liquid and mix with the aromatics and olive oil to create an instant sauce. You can serve everyone their own clam packet along with grilled French bread or serve the clams on top of pasta.

Practical Hints on Fishing for Trout Hardy Brothers Magazine 1888

Here is the first page from an article written over 120 years ago. I thought it was an accurate description of why we fly fish and holds true today. It applies not only to trout fishing, but also to saltwater flats fishing. I had to make one little edit at the end.

PBACTICAL HINTS ON FLY FISHING FOR TROUT, ETC.

Fly-fishing for Trout is perhaps one of the most enjoyable sports practised on the waters of this country, and he who has not been educated to the true enjoyment of it, has suffered a great loss.

In the perfect casting and delivery of the fly, there is the same enjoyment as is experienced by the clever shot or billiard player, who prides himself on the true and perfect working harmony of hand and eye. But this is all the comparison, for besides the pleasure of perfect casting and eager expectation, there is all the excitement of stalking and ultimate capture, while the great uncertainty of the latter, adds not a little to the charm. Then if we take into consideration, that the angler is necessarily something of an entomologist and a naturalist in general, we may fearlessly say, that angling is perhaps the most truly enjoyable sport a man can indulge in. person **Club member David Eddy reports:** "Covid put a crimp in my fly fishing, but I did manage a fly fishing trip to South Louisiana that accomplished one of my long-time goals - catching a big, bull redfish on a fly. I went out with Ron at <u>Marsh Dawn</u> and he really knew where to find the fish. It was my first exposure to sight-fishing and I was fortunate to overcome inexperience and land this red. A long fight I'll long remember." Good job David!



Winter Fishing in Colorado

My wife Lou and I spent three weeks in Colorado in March to get winter weather. On a couple of mild days we visited Rocky Mountain National Park and got in some trout fishing on the Big Thompson river as it flows into Lake Estes. We caught rainbows and tiger trout. Tiger trout are fairly rare hybrids between a brook and brown trout. Tiger trout are aggressive, and although they have similar diets to other trout species when they're small, most switch to a diet of baitfish once they grow larger. Because of this, they can get fairly large. My two tiger trout were little guys and they hit a green wooly bugger. Lou caught her rainbows on a Tenkara outfit and a size 18 midge.

Ozello Snook

We (Ted Hagaman, Robert Fischer, Bruce Anderson and myself) took two small boats to Ozello on a Friday in mid-March to try our luck. Ozello is about 1 ½ hours north between Homosassa and Crystal River. This area has beautiful clear water, mangrove islands, oyster bars and good tidal movement. The bottom holds a variety of sea grasses and plants. This great habitat is home to good numbers of game fish for sight fishing. Club member Robert Fischer caught his personal best 38" snook on a Zara Spook. We found a few reds to follow our flies, but no luck with those often spooky fish. Ozello is perfect water to explore using a kayak or paddleboard and is reminiscent of the Everglades back-country. Grab lunch at Pecks, an old fashioned bar and grill near the boat ramp.

P.S. we donned life jackets that morning to keep warm till the sun came up.

Fishing Report and Forecast "What a great time to go fishing!"

Captain Pat Damico reports: "Make the best of difficult fly fishing conditions!" "Minimum wind and cloudless skies elevate a fly fisher's chance for a good day when fishing our west coast. Current windy conditions make casting more difficult, unless very experienced, and clouds interfere with sight casting opportunities because fish aren't visible in the shallows where we do most of our fly fishing. Dirty water and rough boating conditions add to the difficulty. We are fortunate in having many rivers that empty into Tampa Bay as well as the Gulf. A boat or paddle craft is necessary to allow mobility as well as safety. Rivers get narrower as you head upstream and offer wind protection from tree-covered banks. Most fish we are interested in will be structure-oriented. Your casting now will be to fallen trees, undercut banks, points of land, sandbars, mouths of small creeks, and tree cover close to the water surface. Any interruption in normal shorelines should be investigated with probing accurate casts. Outgoing tides are generally preferred especially where baitfish are forced out of small creeks and can locate in adjacent deeper water. Moving water is very important to success. Equipment is similar to fishing the flats. An 8-weight rod rigged with a floating weight forward line would be the first choice rigged with a popper or shallow running baitfish imitation that duplicates available forage in size and color. Baby tarpon, snook, jacks, and redfish will be the primary targets. Another 9-weight rod with a clear sink tip and weighted fly will really cover deeper water where larger fish often lurk. If snook and baby tarpon are targeted, include a 30-pound hard monofilament shock tippet to prevent break-offs."

Capt Rick Grassett reports: Look for reds, snook and larger trout in shallow water. Fishing deep grass flats of Sarasota Bay is a usually a good choice for action with a variety of species including trout, pompano, Spanish mackerel and more. Snook at night around dock lights in the ICW is also a good option depending on conditions. Our natural resources are under constant pressure from red tides fueled by industrial, agricultural and residential runoff, toxic spills and discharges, freezes, increasing fishing pressure and habitat loss and degradation, please limit your kill, don't kill your limit!
